

Everything About the Gospel is Offensive

During an Adult Catechism Class we discussed how offensive the whole idea of eating someone's flesh and drinking someone's blood is. This was especially true of Jews in Jesus' day. Kosher butchering to this day meticulously drains the blood from an animal because the blood belongs to God. It is not for human consumption. It makes for weak gravy. And Jesus tells us to eat His flesh and drink His blood. Yuck!

The incarnation is offensive. No self-respecting god would put aside its "godness" and become human.

The birth of our God is offensive. What god would spend 9 months in utero and submit to being passed through a birth canal and begin life totally helpless. Gods do not act that way. Pretend to be human from time to time, maybe; but not for real!

Jesus' teachings are offensive. The sermon on the Mount has nothing to do with being successful. Turn the other cheek? Really?

The sacrament of baptism is equally offensive. What God in their right mind would use water to cleanse us from our sin? This should be my action, not God's.

The crucifixion is offensive. No God would ever die for mere humans. Humans are supposed to serve God, not the other way around. Everyone knows the very definition of a god includes not dying—let alone to pay for our sin! Why does God love me so much?

The resurrection of the body is offensive. Somehow we want to out-spiritualize God. Resting in Peace while we wait for Christ to come again—I want it now!






"If only I had been there!" Luther imagines us saying.

"Jacob seems to be anything but a model disciple. But Jacob is also Israel, the namesake of the Old Testament community of God, chosen and blessed. As such, this sinner-saint, who limps along with the Lord, burdened by weakness and beset by problems, is the mirror image of all of us who follow Jesus. In his life we see our lives, our struggles, our failures, and most especially the God who loves us and chooses us as his own. As we explore his bio, from his wrangling in the womb with Esau to his death as an old man in Egypt, we will learn more about ourselves and the God who is with us and for us in Jesus the Messiah."



A Summer Ministry Project Give a Child the Opportunity to Succeed in School

Why school supplies? To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference in keeping up in class. Public school is free, but few supplies are given to the students. These much needed supplies, may be more than some parents can afford. These supplies will have a HUGE impact on many children's education and love of learning. Please place your donated items in the box in the church narthex or the box in the new narthex (Gathering area). Thank you for your help!

All of us can collect school supplies! For each School Kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks: of wide or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 10½"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler: or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2½" eraser
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps or a standard backpack.

All items should be new and in good condition.
